#### Box 10: Explanation of capital expenditure for the disclosure year

## Capital Expenditure

Capital Expenditure on network asset was \$16,431k which was \$3,500k (18%) below the forecast of \$19,931k set for the disclosure year (March 2016) due primarily to delays in commencing construction on the Hangatiki to Te Awamutu 110kV line from landowner access negotiations. There was also less expenditure on consumer connection, but this was offset to a degree by higher expenditure on asset replacement and renewal.

## **Materiality**

Waipa Networks' materiality threshold is 10% for capital expenditure on any category of network assets capital expenditures exceeding \$250,000. Material projects are also those that span multiple years.

## Box 11: Explanation of operational expenditure for the disclosure year

## **Operational Expenditure**

Overall Operational Expenditure was \$5,729k which was \$610k (12%) above forecast of \$5,119k set for the disclosure year (March 2016). Additional expenditure of \$182k was incurred in the Service Interruptions and Emergencies category due to more storms than usual. None of these storms qualified as exceptional weather events. Additional expenditure of \$139k on Routine and Corrective Maintenance and Inspection was mainly related to increased earth testing.

# Asset Replacement and Renewal

This category involves the replacement and renewal of 11kV poles, crossarms, insulators and conductors, substation sites and, voltage regulator componentry, Ring Main Unit componentry, recloser componentry and 400V distribution pillars that have physically deteriorated and are no longer fit for purpose.

Asset Replacement and Renewal expenditure of \$461k exceeded the forecast of \$355k by \$106k (30%) for the disclosure year (March 2016). Asset replacement and renewal activity is driven by routine asset condition surveys and failures in service. Increased expenditure on transformers and voltage regulator maintenance was a driver.

#### <u>Capital Expenditure</u>

Consumer Connections: Expenditure was \$1,757k which was 24% below the forecast of \$2,314k.

System Growth: Expenditure was \$754k which was 26% above the forecast of \$598k.

Asset Replacement and Renewal: Expenditure was \$1,109k which was 10% below the forecast of \$1,237k.

Asset Relocation: Expenditure was \$103k which exceeded forecast of \$97k by \$6k (7%) due to Local Council and NZTA road redevelopment and deviations.

Reliability, Safety and Environment (Quality of Supply): Expenditure was \$11,983k which fell short of the forecast of \$15,393k by \$3,410k (22%) due primarily to protracted progress on securing property rights for the Hangatiki to Te Awamutu 110kV line delaying the start of construction.

Reliability, Safety and Environment (Other Reliability, Safety and Environment): Expenditure was \$725k which exceeded the forecast of \$292k by \$433k (148%). This included \$80k of undergrounding feeder sections that crossed the Hangatiki – Te Awamutu 110kV line route, and \$80k of undergrounding high load route road crossings to improve safety.

Expenditure on Non-Network Assets: Annual budget \$158k, actual expenditure was \$158k. \$100k was budgeted for the seismic reinforcement of Cambridge Ripple Plant building, of which \$43k was classified as capital and the balance was classified as maintenance. A new vehicle was purchased (\$37k) that had not been allowed for in the budget.

### Operational Expenditure

Service Interruptions and Emergencies: Expenditure was \$817k which exceeded the forecast of \$635k by \$182k (29%) primarily due to more storms than usual.

Vegetation Management: Expenditure of \$560k exceeded the forecast of \$501k by \$59k (12%) due to reactive tree trimming.

Routine and Corrective Maintenance and Inspection: Expenditure was \$949k which exceeded the forecast of \$810k by \$139k (17%) due to increased earth testing.

Asset replacement and Renewal: Expenditure was \$461k which exceeded the forecast of \$355k by \$106k (30%) due to more voltage regulator and switchgear maintenance.

Non-Network Operational Expenditure: Expenditure was \$2,942k which was within 4% of forecast of \$2,818k.

Overall Operational Expenditure was \$5,729k which was within 12% of forecast of \$5,119k.

No atypical capital or operational expenditure has been incurred during the disclosure year (March 16).

Target revenue for 2016 was \$24,526K as disclosed in Schedule 7 (Comparison of Forecasts to Actual Expenditure). The total billed line charge revenue for 2016 was \$23,956K.

The variance between target revenue and total billed revenue for the year is (2.32)%.

The targeted revenue is from the 2014 pricing methodology as these were restated in the 2015 pricing methodology to reflect the fact that our pricing did not change from 1 April 2015 and therefore was based on these figures. The target revenue is pre posted discounts and includes charges to sub networks. Adjusted target revenue for 2016 was \$22,546K. The variance between the adjusted target revenue and total billed revenue for the year is 6.25%.

SAIFI and SAIDI by class for network reliability

Planned SAIFI for the network was 0.16 compared to AMP 2015 target of 0.14

Planned SAIDI for the network was 43.5 minutes compared to AMP 2015 target of 35 minutes

Unplanned SAIFI for the network was 2.09 compared to AMP 2015 target of 2.28

Unplanned SAIDI for the network was 146.6 minutes compared to AMP 2015 target of 134 minutes

Total SAIFI for the network was 2.25 compared to AMP 2015 target of 2.42

Total SAIDI for the network was 190.1 minutes compared to AMP 2015 target of 169 minutes

There were no exceptional weather events or other operational events during the disclosure year (March 2016). However, there were a high number of storms which resulted in a numerous trees toppling into power lines and wind borne tree debris from trees outside the Notice Zone shorting out power lines. Other major contributions to unplanned SAIDI were third party damage from car versus pole accidents and failed insulators. These had a significant adverse effect on unplanned SAIDI minutes during 2015/16.

Waipa Networks achieved two out of six reliability targets set in AMP 2015 for network reliability in the disclosure year.
